In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

Considering Returning to our Three-Service Schedule: A Note from the Rector

I am wondering, along with quite a few folks from the parish, if we could now return to our full three-service schedule. The reason we changed our schedule was, of course, COVID. We would likely return to something like 8AM and 9AM or (9:15AM) in Zabriskie, followed often by coffee hour and regular forum hours in the Parish Hall, followed by the 11:15 AM in Immanuel, or possibly 8AM and 9AM in Zabriskie and 10:30 AM in Immanuel, although this would make finding a good time for forum hours more difficult. All of our services might look a bit smaller as we first re-start this schedule, but the hope would be that more options would help in bringing more people back to Church. It would also be a move back towards a more "normal" Immanuel schedule. We would still join together as before for major holidays and for Summer. The logistics and various considerations are many: choirs, lectors, Altar Guild, ushers, chalicists, acolytes, two coffee hours, etc., etc., but we should still remember how to do all of this! I invite you to mull this over, pray about it, and be in touch with me with your thoughts and questions.
