The First Lesson: Acts 17:22-31

Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, “Athenians, I see how extremely religious you are in every way. For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, ‘To an unknown god.’ What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things. From one ancestor he made all nations to inhabit the whole earth, and

he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, so that they would search for God and perhaps grope for him and find him—though indeed he is not far from each one of us. For ‘In him we live and move and have our being’; as even some of your own poets have said, ‘For we too are his offspring.’

Since we are God’s offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like gold, or silver, or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of mortals. While God has overlooked the times of human ignorance, now he commands all people everywhere to repent, because he has fixed a day on which he will have the world judged in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed, and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead.”

Keep your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who abuse you for your good conduct in Christ may be put to shame. For it is better to suffer for doing good, if suffering should be God's will, than to suffer for doing evil. For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water. SOLAR PROJECT UPDATE - APRIL 30, 2023

Since our church's solar panels went live on **June 7, 2022**, they have produced over **54,000 kWh of clean, sustainable electricity**. This represents **83 percent** of the electricity our solar vendor, SES, estimates the system to generate annually. It also represents over 84,000 pounds of carbon dioxide not emitted into the atmosphere and is the equivalent of **635 trees being planted!** The Immanuel Church-on-the-Hill solar panels daily show a public and visible commitment to Creation Care and an example to our children and our community to reduce carbon emissions—that we are true and faithful stewards of “this fragile earth, our island home”.

The solar panels are also saving us money. Immanuel has received ten months of Dominion Energy electricity bills since our solar panels went live. See the **weekly e-Blast** for more details, but here's the bottom line on cost savings:

- Zabriskie/Parish Hall used roughly the same amount of electricity (measured in kWh) for the past ten “solar months” (June – Dec 2022 and January – March 2023) as used during same ten pre-solar months in 2021. However, because **our solar panels generated 64 percent of the electricity the building used**, the cost of power purchased from Dominion was \$ **4,085.48** versus **\$8,264.69** – a **savings to date of \$4,179.21** (over 2021 costs for same ten months).
- In addition to electricity bill savings, Immanuel expects to receive approximately \$3000/year from the Virginia Solar Renewable Energy Credit (SREC) program. The first two checks totaling **\$1,785.00** arrived in December 2022 and February 2023. When you apply Immanuel's SREC income so far, actual cost for electricity for the ten “solar months” is \$2,300.48 – a savings of nearly \$6,000 (over 2021 pre-solar electricity costs for same ten months).

The solar panels generate the most electricity during March through October. It will take a complete year of monitoring both the solar electricity production and checking our Dominion bills for annual generation and dollar numbers.

Many thanks to all who believed in the solar project! Some donated to take direct action to reduce carbon emissions; others to help the church save money. Most probably saw both as reasons to make it happen. If you haven't already done so, consider making the same kind of solar investment in your own home!
