And, we can support our partners who toil daily to ensure our neighbors in need are sustained in mind, body and spirit.

Walgreens will come again this year to Immanuel to give flu shots to folks 4 and older. In addition to the regular flu vaccine, they will bring a limited number of high dose vaccine for seniors over the age of 65. We will have a tent set up next to the Zabriskie parking lot -- complete the consent form in your car, then come to the tent for your shot! Bring your insurance card, wear a shirt with ready access to the upper arm, and wear a face mask.

If you want to get your flu shot, please contact Lisa Clausen (<u>Lisa.clausen@verizon.net</u> or 703-629-4814) in advance so that we enough vaccine available. Especially important in this pandemic year!



SAVE THE DATE: October 11th BLESSING OF THE ANIMALS, 5p.m. Zabriskie Parking Lot




